## 50 year jubilee of the Institute

Dear Academician, Director, Professor Nikolay Kradin,

dear friends and colleagues,

Fifty years ago, no one could have dreamed what a magnificent and highly successful path the Institute of History, Archaeology and Ethnology, Far Eastern Branch of the Russian Academy of Sciences, would take. The political world has changed as fundamentally since 1971 as our now highly technical working world, and unimagined opportunities for research have opened up. This is truly a cause for great celebration.

Just as the city of Vladivostok has evolved from an inaccessible, heavily fortified military base to an important economic center in the booming Asia-Pacific region, the institute has taken advantage of the changing environment and become a scientific hub for joint research with colleagues in Japan, Korea, China, and Mongolia.
